(For the 11<sup>th</sup>/12<sup>th</sup> graders, *Eagle of the Ninth* and *Bronze Bow* count as one because they are of a low reading level). To receive the extra credit, the student must have a parent's signature verifying that they have in fact read the specified book.

Please note that additional student reading is not limited to these lists. We hope that a student may enjoy a particular author or two and choose to read other works by that author. Happy Reading!
