The following books are offered in addition to the regular reading assignments that will be provided in history and literature courses. The Boni Libri readings are accessible and enjoyable – they are designed to nurture a love of reading. The books on each list are related to the period of study in history and literature for 2018-19. Students will be *encouraged* (not required) to read SIX books on the list –two over the summer and one per quarter during the school year. If desired, all or most of the books may be read over the summer. Although there is no requirement to read the recommended books, by way of encouragement, students who read will be eligible to receive 5% extra credit on a literature/history homework or participation grade of their choice (per book). To receive the extra credit, the student must have a parent's signature verifying that they have in fact read the specified book.

Please note that additional student reading is not limited to these lists. We hope that a student may enjoy a particular author or two and choose to read other works by that author. Happy Reading!
