Veritas does not charge additional fees for classroom textbooks or supplies. Students are required to purchase school supplies from the School Supply List, school uniforms and PE uniforms. Students may be required to pay for class field trips or optional class activities.

Tuition Assistance

Veritas Academy offers need-based financial assistance to families on a first-come, first-served basis as funds are available. Levels of tuition assistance offered will depend on a number of factors including total (gross) family income, number of family members, and the number of children enrolled at Veritas. If you are applying for financial assistance to help with tuition expenses you must complete a FACTS financial aid application online (see http://www.veritassavannah.org/admissions/financial-aid), submit all required documentation to FACTS, and pay the FACTS application fee) at the same time you submit your admissions application. It is expected that families will pursue every other available means of financial assistance (family, other scholarship funds, etc.) prior to applying for aid directly from Veritas.

Enrollment Deposit

Families whose children have been accepted to Veritas will receive an enrollment contract that must be completed and returned to the school. This signed enrollment contract must be accompanied by an enrollment deposit totaling one-twelfth (1/12) of the family's total tuition obligation. Payment of the enrollment deposit will guarantee your child's placement in the classroom.

Payment Plans

The remaining tuition balance after payment of the one-twelfth deposit may be paid using one of the following payment plans:

1-Pay Plan: One (1) lump sum payment due on June 1.

12-Pay Plan: Twelve (12) equal payments due on or before the first day of each month beginning with June 1, with the final payment due on or before May 1. If the one-twelfth deposit payment is made early (prior to May 1), eleven monthly payments will begin July 1 and continue through May 1.

Payments on the 12-Pay Plan must be made through FACTS and incur a one-time processing fee from FACTS. You must set up automatic electronic monthly payments by creating a login and entering your payment information on FACTS immediately after the enrollment contract is signed and the deposit is paid. Uniforms

ADMISSIONS PROCEDURES AND GUIDELINES

- Since Veritas Academy is a covenantal school (whose purpose, as noted, is to serve Christian parents who are striving to educate their children to the glory of God), at least one parent of each student shall be able to give a credible testimony of a saving relationship with Christ, be a member in good standing of a local church, and be in essential agreement with the doctrines in the Statement of Faith, section 3.5.D(ii) (Evangelical doctrinal affirmations) and 3.5D(iii) (affirmations on the Sanctity of Life, Marriage, Gender, and Sexuality).
- Both parents (parent(s) or guardian(s) whose names appear on the Enrollment Contract) must agree to have their child(ren) taught in accordance with the full Statement of Faith (Policy 3.5, including the affirmations on the Sanctity of Life, Marriage, Gender, and Sexuality).
- 3. Parents must understand the school's commitment to parental responsibility for their child's education. Veritas Academy exists to assist parents in the godly training of their children, not to take over responsibility for the education of their children. Both parents must understand and be in agreement with the educational Mission, Foundational Commitments, Approach, and Goals of Veritas. Both parents must agree to collaborate with the teachers in being engaged in and responsible for the home-based academic work assigned to their students.
- 4. Each family must read the school's Statement on the Sanctity of Life, Marriage, Gender, and Sexuality, (the third section of the Statement of Faith, Policy 3.5.D(iii) and the Code of Student Conduct (Policy 8) and agree that their children will abide by the moral standards and institutional commitments therein.
- Each family is required to have their pastor (or similar church leader) submit a completed Pastor Recommendation Form affirming the family's Christian testimony and local church membership.
- Both parents must read the Parent/Student Handbook prior to completing an application for admissions.
- The parents must be committed to cooperating with the policies of the school Board. This is most important in the areas of discipline and schoolwork.
- 8. All children applying for admission to Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten must demonstrate academic and developmental readiness. A child must reach the age of four (4) years by August 1 of the year in which he enters Pre-Kindergarten at Veritas Academy. A child must reach the age of five (5) by August 1 of the year in which he enters Kindergarten at Veritas Academy.
- Children entering subsequent grades will be admitted to a grade based on having performed satisfactorily on an Admissions Assessment Tests for the grade to which they are applying.
- 10. For applicants entering 1st grade or above: Academic portfolios, copies of standardized achievement test scores, and recent report cards for each student that is applying must

- be submitted with the Application for Admission. As part of the application process and evaluation, Veritas Academy will also examine the student's records and transcripts from previous schools attended.
- 11. Two Letters of Recommendation must be completed by teachers and/or administrators from the most recent school attended (preferably one teacher and one administrator).
- 12. Upon receipt of the completed Admission Application, Supplemental Questionnaire, Pastor Recommendation, other required documents, and application fee (and financial assistance application if applicable), a family interview with the Headmaster will be scheduled. At the interview, the family's questions about Veritas Academy will be answered and the school's expectations will be clarified. Each parent and enrolling student must participate in the family interview.
- 13. New students will be assessed in Reading, Writing, Math and Grammar to determine their academic readiness for the program at Veritas Academy. Assessment results and prior records will be used to determine the suitability of the Veritas Academy program for the student's needs. Students who perform below the standards for entrance into a particular grade level may be recommended for placement in a lower grade. New students, particularly older students, will also be evaluated for Christian character, academic motivation, love of learning, and desire to attend Veritas.
- 14. The school will contact the parents with the decision regarding acceptance. If accepted, the family will receive a letter of acceptance and an Enrollment Contract. The school will also notify parents with respect to decisions regarding any requests for financial assistance.
- 15. The enrollment contract must be signed and returned to the school with the Enrollment Deposit (one-twelfth of the total tuition obligation for the family). An enrollment contract will provide a record of the agreement between parents or legal guardian(s) and Veritas Academy and specify the duties and responsibilities of each party pertaining to the admission of the family's children to Veritas Academy. All financial arrangements between the family and the school must be clearly understood before the admissions process is considered final. An enrollment contract will be issued and signed annually. Each parent will read and sign the Parent Contract. The original will be retained in the student's permanent file and a copy will be provided to the parent(s). This Parent Contract is to be completed before the student starts classes at Veritas Academy.
- 16. Parents are required to attend the annual parent orientation meeting held at the beginning of the new school year. After acceptance to Veritas, parents will be required to submit emergency contact information and other pertinent documents prior to the first day of school.
- 17. The child should understand that his parents have delegated their authority to Veritas Academy while the child is in school. He is therefore subject to the instruction and discipline of the teachers and staff while in school.

Answer Key to Supplemental Admissions Questionnaire

Why are we giving you an open-book test? It's like a driver's license examination. You get the questions and answers ahead of time because the goal is not to flunk applicants, but rather to make sure they read and understand the lesson. Every one of these questions deals with real issues and concerns we have at Veritas. When you read these answers, which reflect the school's philosophy, you may wholeheartedly agree, or you may not agree at all. If you do NOT agree, then you have three choices of action. First, you may decide not to enroll your child and choose another school more in keeping with your philosophy and goals. Second, you may honestly express your disagreement, but agree to comply with our policies and philosophy of education. Third, you may merely "say" you agree now and then object later, causing difficulties for your child, our staff and anyone else involved. If Veritas is not a school you can appreciate and support without significant reservations, the best course would be to back out gracefully now. The Lord God (Deuteronomy 6:4-9 and Ephesians 6:4) requires parents to be active leaders in the education of their children, but that responsibility does not include trying to re-shape an entire class or institution to fit their individual preferences. However, positive criticism and ideas are always welcome, especially when they are in line with our adopted philosophy. We are eager to answer any questions you may have which will help you make a wise decision for your children.

- 1. You would be surprised how often a parent will object to just one facet of the curriculum or program. They may love the reading program, but don't see why their child has to memorize, or take Latin, or wear a school-approved uniform. We have prayerfully made many choices concerning our curriculum and program, and we believe we have made sound decisions. We expect parents to support them. We are constantly seeking to upgrade the curriculum and make positive changes to our program. However, no aspect of the curriculum is optional (for full-curriculum students), and school policies should be willingly obeyed. If your attitude is not supportive, your child will pick it up, and this will be reflected in his work and attitude at school.
- 2. Conflicts should be resolved at the lowest level possible, in accordance with the principles of Matthew 18. If you have a problem with a teacher, the Headmaster, a board member, or other parents, you must first meet with the person involved, and if an agreement cannot be reached, both parties should then approach the next level of authority. You should never gossip with other parents about a problem at the school.
- 3. Answers to this question will vary from family to family and child to child. We simply wish to get an idea of what values are important to your family.
- 4. Wise parents will not contribute to modern society's worship of success by paying too much attention to the outward marks of achievement. Our goal is for every student to do his best and work up to his potential in every area. Not every student can slam-dunk a basketball and not every student can get "straight A's" at Veritas Academy. Each student has his unique strengths and weaknesses.
- 5. One of Veritas Academy's greatest strengths is academic excellence. Our curriculum goals are relatively rigorous and demand much effort from every student. We have "set the bar high" in our academic standards. The "average" student may have to work very hard to get average grades at Veritas. We define an average grade as a "C." Parents of students who must work harder to keep up with the academic demands may well need to limit extracurricular activities, spend extra time helping with school work, or even secure an outside tutor to assist the student.
- 6. We base our homework assignments and expectations on what we have come to believe are reasonable, necessary amounts for most students. We also highly value family time and will do all we can to respect it. While the condensed day at Veritas requires that a significant amount of school work gets done at home, we are careful to keep homework at a very reasonable level. It is very important to understand that the amount of time spent on homework by any particular student can vary greatly within any classroom. The focused, diligent, and/or stronger students will generally have lighter homework loads. The students who do not wisely use the time given

in class to complete assignments or who are seriously challenged by the assignments will most likely have heavier homework loads.

- 7. Students transferring into Veritas Academy will often find that good grades are harder to come by at this school. A grade of "C" may represent average achievement at Veritas, but may also represent excellent effort by a given student. That student who is working at their highest potential should not be made to feel inferior by a parent's unreasonable expectation for higher marks. If you want uniformly high grades, this may not be the school for you. If you want high achievement and a substantive education, it is. Veritas rejects the nearly ubiquitous trend of inflating grades that has been place in our country for the past fifty years
- 8. A teacher's attention is never going to be evenly divided among students; nor is a parent's among his own children, but there is a point beyond which we are being unfair to the compliant majority. Veritas operates under a conservative budget and limited resources. As much as we would like, we simply can't be all things to all people. This applies to students with learning disabilities as well. Such students are welcome at Veritas, provided they can function in a traditional classroom setting and fulfill our academic and behavioral expectations without special or additional instruction from our staff. Whether a student is struggling to catch up to our expectations or has special learning needs, parents will be primarily responsible for providing and/or securing any additional assistance needed by the student.
- 9. There is no single correct answer here. We simply want to know what is important to your family and how you go about nurturing your children in their faith.
- 10. Although the Scriptures allow for a spectrum of parenting styles, we believe that the Bible provides parents with a number of key principles that should be applied in the training and discipline of children. These key principles include, but may not be limited to:
 - Parents should cultivate a distinctly Christian culture in the home (Deuteronomy 6:6-7; Ephesians 6:4).
 - God requires parents to train their children in a God-centered way (Deuteronomy 6:6-7).
 - The father is ultimately and primarily responsible for child training (Ephesians 6:4).
 - The chief goal must be to train children to fear the Lord and love Him with their whole being, (Ephesians 6:4, Deuteronomy 6:1-9).
